## STAFF AND CHILDREN

- 98 children call Ogada their home.
- There are 42 children from 13-18 years old.
- 2 children completed their education.
- In January, the social worker attended a seminar at another CFH home.
- In August, the house mothers attended a 3-day seminar in Nairobi on Theraplay techniques.

## CAMPUS

- A vehicle was purchased for the home.
- There were renovations done for staff housing.
- There is a need for more water tanks to store water from the catchment system.
- The perimeter fence is in need of repair.

## Priority Needs:

Renovations to the boys and girls bathrooms (this is currently in progress)

## HOLISTIC CARE

- The children did not receive any dental check-ups.
- The children have enough clothes for school and play.
- The children received their regular deworming medication.
- There is an emergency response plan in place.
- There was a VBS at Ogada this past summer.
- Most children need their own Bible.
- The upper primary classes are struggling with their grades.

## SUSTAINABILITY

- The home has 220 chickens which provides eggs for the children.
- There are 4 cows and 2 calves.
- There is a flourishing garden that supports the nutritional needs of the children.
- The fruit grove is producing fruit.
- These projects has saved the home \$1,698.
- The solar inverters continue to provide electricity during power outages.
- Financial reports are submitted monthly to Chariots' U.S. office.
